game and chewed up 169 yards on 50 carries. Running back Chris Brown accounted for 94 of those yards on 26 carries. Quarterback Mark Zamorski (4 completions, 11 attempts, 46 yards, 3 interceptions, 1 TD) carried 13 times for 48 yards.

Penalties put a crimp into both teams' efforts. The Blue Devils were penalized six times for 60 yards, while the Cougars were penalized 10 times for 100 yards.

Defensively, the Blue Devils' two big linemen, Cowles Stewart and Santo Nardi, delivered several crushing blows to Zamorski and Brown. Linebackers Will Harbaugh, Shaffer and Yarusi, end Matt Ince and tackle Joe Schurig also made some key tackles. King had a key interception at the Westfield 10-yard line and returned it to the 23 to stop a Cougar drive late in the first quarter. That set up the Blue Devils' first TD drive that consisted of six plays and was concluded when DeRosa hit Yarusi in the left flat near the first down marker and he tore down the sideline for the TD with 10:19 left in the half.

"We played with our hearts in the game and it's a shame to see us lose," commented Shaffer. "We knew that we would be able to get some nice passes because we scouted them. I

think our defensive line had a great game."

Describing his two completions, Yarusi said, "It was a 35 waggle and DeRosa reeled them all in, and I was open in the flat. It's a nice play."

Blue Devil safety Marcus Graham added an interception late in the first half. Defensive end John Dugan nailed Zamorski to force a fumble recovered by linebacker Kyle Zeitounian at the Cougar 28. Five plays later, Bonard kicked his 26-yard field goal to put Westfield up 10-7 with 9:20 left in the third quarter. Zeitounian added an interception late in the quarter.

After Westfield took a 7-0 lead, the Cougars tied the score on a 16-play, 67-yard march that concluded with Zamorski's one-yard sneak. On the two previous plays, the Blue Devil line stuffed Brown for no gain.

With 3:46 remaining in the game, Zamorski fired over the middle into the end zone where Tony Somma was credited with a diving, nine-yard TD completion to put Cranford in front, 13-10. The point after failed.

Westfield responded when DeRosa hit Rogers at the Cougar 22 for a 43-yard completion. Bonard attempted a 39-yard field goal with 2:44 remaining but came up short. The Blue Devil defense held tight and gave the offense another chance. DeRosa connected with Rogers for gains of four and 11 yards, respectively, and a 15-yard penalty gave Westfield a first down at the Cougar 25. DeRosa then fired to Rogers on a crossing pattern but the ball deflected off his fingertips and Smith made his game-saving interception at the 10.

"Against Cranford, it's a rivalry and we really wanted to win," said Yarusi. "I'm really proud of our team. We have a young team and we got two unlucky breaks in a row."
