## Stamler PD Academy Recruit Awarded P.B.A. Scholarship

SCOTCHPLAINS - Union County Police Academy Alternate Route recruit Kimberly Raguse of North Plainfield had two surprises on August 31. The first was when Union County Prosecutor's Office P.B.A. Local No. 250 officers called her to the front of the room to receive a \$1,230 scholarship. The second was when her 92 classmates gave her a standing ovation.

male recruit who currently is attending the academy. The scholarship recipient is selected from all female Alternate Route recruits, who are asked to submit an application, replete with an essay on why she wants to be a police officer, he said.

P.B.A. officers making the presentation included Detectives Russo, Vincent G. Gagliardi, Treasurer, and William Mannix, State Delegate.

The presentation of the check was made at the John H. Stamler Police Academy in Scotch Plains, where Recruit Raguse is a member of Police Academy Class 93's basic police training class. The members of this Police Benevolent Association recently created this scholarship to honor one of their own fallen sisters - Sergeant Paula Lerman, who lost a long battle with cancer in 1993.

The Police Academy's Alternate Route program enables selected candidates to participate in the New Jersey Police Training Commission Basic Course for Police Officers without first being appointed to a municipal or county police agency. The Alternate Route recruit pays his or her own \$1,285 tuition for the 20-week class, which starts in July and culminates in graduation in mid-December.

"We are honored to present this first scholarship award to Recruit Raguse," said Detective James C. Russo, P.B.A. President. "Sergeant Lerman, who actually designed the first 'Land of Secrets' interview room for child abuse victims, was a pioneer in the field of child advocacy and a warm and highly regarded fellow law enforcement officer. We are pleased to honor her in such a way that also can help ease some of the financial pressure an Alternate Route recruit faces."

P.B.A. Local No. 250 was chartered in 1972. Currently, over 70 detectives with the Union County Prosecutor's Office are members. This fraternal organization fosters brotherhood and sisterhood amongst its members, and "has emphasized taking care of its own and other law enforcement officers who suffer hardship or who are in need," Detective Russo said.
