After a relatively even first 28 minutes, Young brought the ball down the center of the field as sophomore forward Jarek Cohen slipped left around a Blue Devil defender. Young crossed to Cohen who drilled a left-footer into the net to give the Raiders a 1-0 lead.

"I was coming down the left side and Sean got the ball and put it behind the defender. It was just a run that I made and Sean noticed it and put it through. It was a good look on Sean's part," explained Cohen.

With 3:07 left in the first half, Blue Devil junior Andy Brill tied the score after a corner kick sailed into senior Tad Walsh who flicked it over to Brill.

"We were working on foot plays in practice and I just ran out to the back post. Tad did a good job getting it to my feet," explained Brill. "I'm proud of my guys."

Young's goal came off Bell's perfect throw in from the left side into the box where he managed to get a head above the defenders.

"They were triple-teaming me the whole game. This one, I took a couple steps back and was wide open. I had to get off the ground a little bit. He (defender) tried to undercut me but I still got it in the goal. I'm happy we got the win," said Young.

"Jimmy (McManus) played a great game. A variety of people played a great game on both sides. Both goalkeepers played very well. (Matt Melino in the midfield, all our
