White Noise 5/6 Boys Defeat Strykers for Soccer Crown

The White Noise boys soccer team won the Westfield 5th/6th grade boys soccer championship with a 2-0 shut-out over the Strykers in the playoff finals.

Forward Sam Sarokin scored the first goal midway through the first half as Alex Corea drove down the right side of the field, crossed the ball to the center of the field where Sam DeJohn got a foot on it and relayed it to Sarokin, who found a clean shot. The clincher came with less than 10 minutes to play in the game as Nick Constantine came down field on a three-on-one breakaway and beat the goalie cleanly.

The Noise made it to the playoff finals by beating Team France 1-0

in the semifinal match with the winning goal coming from a block of a goal kick and a sliding put-away by Adam Rush. Goalies Constantine and Corea combined on the double shutouts.

The championship capped a fine year for the Noise who finished the regular season with an 8-2 record, scoring 27 goals and allowing just seven. The offense was a balanced attack throughout the season with 12 team members scoring goals and everyone having at least two assists. The Board of Adjustment of the Town of Westfield, New Jersey will meet on Monday, January 8, 2007 in Council Chambers at the Municipal Building, 425 East Broad Street, Westfield, New Jersey at 7:30 p.m. to hear and consider the following appeals for variance(s) from the requirements of the Westfield Land Use Ordinance.

Regina & Andrew Calcagno, 256 Canterbury Road, Applicant seeking permission to install an inground pool contrary to section 13.02D3 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a setback for pools of 15 feet. Proposed is ± 6 feet.

Mr. & Mrs. David Ferry, 105 Golf Edge, Applicant seeking permission to construct a front porch contrary to section 11.03.E.5 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a front yard setback of 44.8 feet (EFYD). Present is 45.63 feet. Proposed is 39.63 feet.

AHB Enterprises, LLC, 462 West Broad Street, Applicant seeking site plan approval to construct a covered stairway from the rear of the second floor to grade as an additional means of egress. Applicant operates a day care facility and such stairway would allow children to occupy the second floor. Since a day care facility is not a permitted use in the RM-6 zone, the aforementioned proposal would constitute an expansion of a non-conforming use. Applicant seeks variances from the following sections of the Land Use Ordinance:

Section 11.12A - Permitted uses do not include a day care facility.

Section 11.12E10 - Maximum allowable coverage by buildings & structures is 20%. Present is 38%. Proposed is 39%.

Section 11.12E11 - Maximum allowable coverage by all improvements is 50%. Present is 67%. Proposed is 68%.

Thomas Forqash, 1325 Prospect Street, Applicant seeking permission to construct a three-season, screened, porch addition to the rear of his house contrary to section 11.03E7 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a rear yard setback of 60 feet. Proposed is ± 50 feet.

Timothy & Dana Amman, 718 Woodland Avenue, Applicant seeking permission to construct a decorative peak on the roof, at the front of the house contrary to section 12.03D of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a front yard setback of 38.8 feet (EFYD). Present and proposed is 24.9 feet.

Joseph Buontempo, 254 Seneca Place, Applicant seeking permission to park a van with commercial signage on residential property contrary to section 15.03B of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance does not permit a van with commercial signage to be parked on residential property.

James & Christine Ryan, 160 Cottage Place, Applicant seeking permission to

install an in-ground pool contrary to sections 13.02D3 and 13.02H1 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a minimum setback of 15 feet from the water line to the property line. Proposed is 6 feet from the water line to the rear and side property lines. Ordinance requires a minimum setback for patios of 5 feet. Proposed is 3 feet.

Timothy & Cynthia Smith, 17 Woodbrook Circle, Applicant seeking permission to construct a second story addition over the existing garage contrary to section 11.06E6 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a minimum side yard setback of 15 feet. Present and proposed is 10 feet.

Bharat Shah, 1026 Ripley Avenue, Applicant seeking permission to construct a first floor addition to the rear of the house contrary to section 11.09E6 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a minimum side yard setback of 10 feet. Present and proposed is 5.9 feet.

The Town Book Store, LLC (Anne Laird) 270 E. Broad Street, Applicant seeking permission to erect two additional signs (for a total of four signs) on a third side of the building contrary to section 16.04E1 and 16.04E2 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance allows signage at the main entrance and on one other side of the building that faces the street. Present are two signs. Proposed are two additional signs on the third side of the building.

Michael Fernandez, 12 Sandra Circle, Applicant seeking permission to construct a front porch on the house contrary to section 12.03D of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires a front yard setback of 31.5 feet EFYD. Present is 30 feet. Proposed is 27 feet.

David & Margaret Norwine, 568 Sherwood Parkway, Applicant seeking permission to retain fence as installed with non-preferred side facing outward contrary to section 12.07G of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance requires fence installation with preferred side to the neighbors. Present and proposed is non-preferred side to the neighbor.

Eric Judka, 568 First Street, Applicant seeking permission to install an 8 feet x10 foot shed in the rear yard contrary to section 12.04F1 of the Land Use Ordinance. Ordinance allows a maximum coverage by buildings and above ground structures (excluding decks and certain porches) of 20%. Proposed is 20.8%.

Variances, waivers or exceptions from certain site plan details or relief from requirements may be sought as appropriate.
