Winners were selected based upon multiple criteria, including academic merit, extracurricular activities, community service, personal achievement and financial need.

Daniel Schwartz was named the recipient of the Keith Hertell, Jr. Memorial Award, given to a WHS senior who excelled in the performing, fine, visual or media arts during his high school career.

Stephen Markowski was named the winner of the Melvyn Coren Memorial Award, given to a WHS senior who exemplifies academic achievement, public charity and community service. Melvyn Coren, who died earlier this year, was a long-time trustee of the College Men's Club of Westfield and spent many years as the club's scholarship chairman.

Over the last 83 years, the College Men's Club of Westfield has aided hundreds of students through the awarding of hundreds of thousands of dollars in scholarship grants. In the last five years, the club has expanded its mission and now provides full tuition scholarships to needy juniors


