Jerome F. Gerold, 82, Was Honored For Heroism During World War II

Jerome Francis Gerold, 82, of Westfield died on Tuesday, June 20, at his home.

Born in Jordan, Minn. on August 22, 1923, the son of the late Nicholas and Rose Lucas Gerold, he had resided in Clark for several years and then in Greenville, S.C. before coming to Westfield two years ago.

Mr. Gerold had been employed as a construction superintendent with Crisdell Corporation in Berkeley Heights for 10 years, retiring in 1985.

During World War II, Mr. Gerold served in the United States Navy from 1942 to 1946 in both the Asian and European theaters. On February 23, 1945 he was a second-class gunner's mate aboard the SS *Henry Bacon* that was transporting Norwegian refugees when it was attacked in the Arctic Ocean by Nazi torpedo bombers. He and fellow Navy Armed Guardsmen downed five German aircraft and several falling torpedoes before one torpedo struck the ship and caused it to sink.

As the ship was sinking, five of the crew and the 19 refugees were lowered into two lifeboats. There were not enough seats for all the ship's crew, however, so Mr. Gerold and others gave up their places in the boats to save the Norwegian civilians. They instead braved the stormy seas aboard a raft before British destroyers rescued the refugees and seamen several hours later.

On March 4, 2005, Mr. Gerold, the last surviving member of the Navy crew rescued after the *Henry Bacon* sank, was honored by King Harald V of Norway and given an award for bravery at a ceremony at the United States Naval Memorial and Heritage Center in Washington, D.C.

A member of the First Baptist Church of Westfield, Mr. Gerold sang in the choir and was a former trustee.

He also was a 50-year member of Lafayette Lodge No. 27 Free and Accepted Masons of Rahway and a member of the Lions Club in Greenville, S.C., where he was active with Eyes For The Needy.

Additionally, he was a member of the Airstream Travel Club and a past president of its Watchung chapter, and a past scoutmaster for the Boy Scouts of America in Clark.

He was a 40-year square dance caller and the only one who used live music while calling, and a self-taught musician who played the guitar.

Surviving are his wife of 63 years, Imogene B. Nash Gerold; two daughters, Sandra Antonelli of Westfield and Sharon G. Smith of Elizabeth, Colo.; a son, Gregory Gerold of Aurora, Ill.; four sisters, Irene Coleman of New Hope, Minn., Rosemary Myers of Inver Grove Heights, Minn., Caroline McFarland of Robbinsdale, Minn., and Ruth Gronli of Palatine, Ill., and five grandchildren.

A memorial service was held on Saturday, June 24, at the First Baptist Church of Westfield with the Reverend Dee Dee Turlington officiating. Private interment will take place at the First Baptist Church Memorial Garden.
