## Miller-Cory Invites Families To 'Crazy Colors' Program

WESTFIELD - The Miller-Cory House Museum will present a program entitled "Crazy Colors...Natural Dyes" on Sunday, October 15, from 2 to 4 p.m. This program is described as ideal for children.

In the Colonial era, after the sheep were sheared and the wool cleaned and combed, the next step was to dye the wool before spinning. Families who lived on farms such as the Miller-Cory House were experts at selecting seasonal materials from nature that would produce the best dyes and colors. Vera Lough will talk about these natural materials and assist participants in dyeing white wool. Ms. Lough also will show children how to use their naturally dyed wool in a number of different crafts.

Museum docents will be available on Sunday to guide visitors through the restored, fully furnished farmhouse. Members of the Cooking Committee will prepare food over the open-hearth fire and offer taste treats for visitors to sample.

The gift shop, which features a wide variety of Colonial toys, crafts,

books and educational materials, will be open for business.

Admission to the museum is \$2.50 for adults and \$1 for students. Children under age four will be admitted for free.
