## Flood Chosen in 4th Round Of Major League Lax Draft

Harvard senior faceoff midfielder, Westfield resident and alumnus of Lawrenceville, John Henry Flood, was chosen by the Washington Bayhawks in the fourth round of the Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft. Flood is Harvard's first player to be chosen in the MLL collegiate draft.  
 Flood was chosen with the second pick of the fourth round - 32nd overall. He competed in the MLL's Warrior Major League Challenge Game held in Stony Brook, Long Island and scored two goals in a game played by the 40 best collegiate players in the country.  
 Flood ranked second among NCAA Division I players in faceoff percentage in 2007 as he won 173 of 258 starts (67.1 percent). He won at least 50 percent of his faceoffs in all 12 Harvard games and finished the sea-
