Kean U. to Offer Business Seminars and Workshops

UNION - The Small Business Development Center (SBDC) of Kean University will host a variety of free seminars and workshops for business owners this June...

The first, "Building and Financing Your Business with the SBA," will take place today, Thursday, June 7, from 10 to 11:30 a.m. at the Plainfield Public Library...

The seminar is designed to provide prospective business owners with information on business loan and technical assistance programs offered by the Small Business Administration (SBA).

Bank-lending officers will be on hand to discuss their role in the SBA's Guaranteed Lending Program.

Lenders will also discuss what goes into a good loan proposal: how to increase the chances of securing a loan and how to navigate the loan application process.

Another seminar titled "Is Business Ownership Right for You?" will be held Tuesday, June 19, from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Plainfield Public Library.

The workshop, conducted by Nick Cohran, president of The Entrepreneur's Source in Summit, is designed for anyone considering self-employment. Mr. Cohran will cover a variety of topics including the "New Career Economy," determining if business ownership holds potential and what one is looking to accomplish by considering a different career.

He will also present an overview of career alternatives beyond the job market, how to create a "yardstick" with which to measure potential opportunities...
