the plate. Dinizo scorched a single to center and Maroney rifled a two-one fastball over the centerfield fence.

The 10-4 Raiders' infield and their speedy outfielders made it difficult for the Vikings to find an opening. Perez had a hand in it when he snagged a grounder that resulted into a Bonardies-Mineo double play in the top of the second.

"He threw a fastball. Threw it right inside on a full count, I believe, and I got lucky with a homerun," said Perez who added, "As the leadoff hitter, I'm just looking to put it in play. Defensively, the double play with one out took them out of an inning. That was great!"

Perez got the action started in the second by working a walk and swiping a base. Antoine followed with a well-placed bunt and Mineo boosted an RBI sacrifice fly ball to left. After Antoine swiped a bag, Bayard smashed an RBI triple. Viking Head Coach Jim Reagan, Jr. called on right hand reliever Joe Fortunato. Dinizo, however got to the right hander by crushing a double to right. Bonardies rocked an RBI triple and scored on D'Annunzio's single, making the

score, 9-0.

In the third, Perez doubled and scored on Antoine's single. The Vikings stopped the bleeding when Whittemore performed a major league diving scoop that resulted in a short-to-second-to-first double play.

"I owe it all pretty much to our offense that got me ahead," said Bayard (3-2). "I got ahead with my fastball, my curveball and finished them off with my slider strikeout pitch. That's what I got all three strikeouts on in the last inning."

"Greg and I have a great chemistry. We're real good friends and that helps a lot. When he's on the mound and I'm catching we feel like no one can hit us. Today, all of his pitches were working. Pitching coach Monti calls all the pitches but I can change them. A lot of times he calls for a fastball that changes to off-speed because I know what Greg likes to throw," added Dinizo. "Offensively, I just stepped up, had to play big like the rest of the team, had a lot of confidence and went out there to do a good job."
