yard TD hook around the left side to Baker. John Domanski connected with the point after with 33 ticks showing in the first quarter.

Early in the third quarter, the Raiders on their first possession, led by the fine running by Taylor, plowed 77 yards to pay dirt in 12 plays, culminating with a five-yard Chervenyak-to-Baker TD toss over the middle, while consuming six minutes off the clock. Domanski nailed the extrapoint with 6:07 left in the quarter.

The Raiders final TD came with 2:13 remaining in the game on a three-play, 31-yard drive when Marcus Green sprinted 14 yards up the gut to the end zone. Domanski's PAT was good.

"After last week's game, we did a much better as a team. Everyone did a great job blocking. On defense everyone came together, everyone rushed to the ball and we gang tack-

led real well," said Baker.

"Last week I did not have too much of a game. This week I buckled down, concentrated and did what I had to do. Coaches like to use me a lot so I do whatever they ask to do," said Marcus Green. "Offense did a good job blocking. We wanted revenge from last week and we brought out our anger onto the Plainfield game. We just outplayed them and we were tougher. The coaches put up a good package, you know, so it was pretty easy."

"Timmy (Green) at linebacker did an outstanding job for us. Marcus (Green) has been playing well and today he played outstanding. Our three linebackers in our stacked defense helped us and when those guys play, you know, you have to have your good players make plays and they're making them," said coach Ciccotelli.

Local 'Y' Women Participate In Danskin Sprint Triathlon

Dubbed *Triwomen SPFW* (Scotch Plains, Fanwood and Westfield), the group has been meeting and training for the event since January. Amy Carow, of Scotch Plains, who participated in last year's Danskin Triathlon and set out to convince 100 local women to compete in 2007, organized *Triwomen SPFW*.

With the support of the F-SP and Westfield Area Ys, as well as local businesses such as Jay's Cycle Center and the Westfield Running Company, free workshops on triathlon related topics were offered to the group after a January kick-off meeting. WF U9 Milan Boys Rap Bandits and Pythons

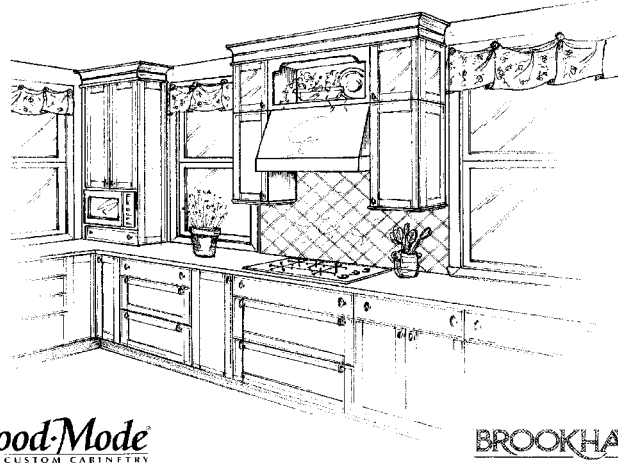
