Stender Files for Another Run Against Ferguson

The Hill, a Capitol Hill newspaper, reported on May 24 that State Assemblywoman Linda Stender of Fanwood officially filed papers in May for a rematch against Rep. Mike Ferguson (R-7) of New Providence. Mrs. Stender, a Democrat, nearly defeated Mr. Ferguson in 2006 in part to declining approval rating in the state by President George W. Bush. The Hill reported that Mr. Ferguson has raised \$418,000 in anticipation of facing Mrs. Stender again.

Stender's Chief of Staff, Ed Oatman, told The Hill that Mrs. Stender needed to file, as funds to the campaign were already coming in. He said Mrs. Stender had not made an official decision to jump into the race.

Lautenberg, Menendez **Announce FTA Grants**

AREA – Senator Frank R. Lautenberg (D-NJ) and Senator Robert Menendez (D-NJ) have announced that the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) has allocated \$525,960 in U.S. Department of Transportation funding to Rutgers University for transportation research.
