## Newmark School Student Rings Opening Bell At NYSE

PLAINFIELD - On April 2, Liam Niederauer, an eighth-grade student at Newmark School, a private special needs school in Plainfield for grades K-9, rang the opening bell at the New York Stock Exchange. Liam, a Far Hills resident diagnosed with autism, was on hand to ring the bell as part of World Autism Awareness Day.

Joining Liam were fellow students Jack Hoffman of Basking Ridge and Andrew Baldwin of Scotch Plains and teacher Pamela Taaffe. Regina Peter, co-founder and co-executive director of Newmark School and Newmark High School in Carteret, was also in attendance.

"It was a tremendous honor to take part in the event and, more importantly, to shine a light on autism," said Ms. Peter. "With an increase in autism prevalence being reported, raising awareness of this disorder is essential."

According to an estimate released last week by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, one in 88 children in the U.S. has an autism spectrum disorder. This figure, which is based on 2008 estimates, is about a 25 percent increase from 2006 estimates.

Newmark School and Newmark High School serve children throughout the state with learning disabilities

and behavioral disorders. In addition to working with students with autism, both schools also specialize in educating students with ADD/ADHD, anxiety, Asperger's Syndrome, Obsessive Compulsive Disorder, Sensory Integration Disorder and Oppositional Defiant Disorder. "Our goal is not only to educate, but to provide students with a structured and supportive learning environment that meets their individual needs and leads to success," said Ms. Peter.
