January 17, 2002: Senior Jackie Cusimano poured in a career-high 33 points to lead the Westfield High School girls basketball team to a 52-50 victory over hosting Newark East Side. Junior Lisa Venezia was the most fluid under the boards as she recorded a career-high, 17 rebounds.

January 17, 2003: Several key bouts - some ending in close decisions - and an outcome that was not decided until the next to the last bout gave a packed house at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School its money's worth. The result was a 38-25, victory by the 11-1 Raiders over the 5-1 Westfield Blue Devils.
