Westfield 11U Black Edges Rival Westfield Silver, 6-5

Westfield Black 11U baseball team edged rival Westfield Silver, 6-5, on July 11 at Gumbert Field. Both teams got a strong two-man pitching performance. Black started Jeffrey Bennett, who went four, and closed with Ethan Wolf. For Silver, Kyle Wynne also pitched the opening four frames, and Nathan Gotz finished.

Silver plated three runs in the top of the first. Alex Park poked an RBI double that scored Nick Manganello. Sean Flynn singled in Park and later crossed home on Gotz's RBI groundout.

Black responded with two runs in its half of the inning. Hinkel singled. Sandy Miller clubbed an RBI double to left-center that Jonathan Brennan tracked down and threw to third to hold the runner. Bennett added an RBI single into center.

Silver scored once in the second when Jesse Katz doubled to score Gavin Tanji. Black clawed back in the third. A trio of singles by Michael Kane, Sean O'Brien and Hinkel resulted in a run. In the fourth, Black knotted the score at four apiece. Kane singled, advanced on Noah Levy's ground ball and scampered home on O'Brien's base hit.

Black went ahead in the fifth. Jack Gerris pounded a triple to the fence in center. Miller ripped an RBI double and scored on Bennett's hit. Silver scored once in the sixth when Felix Bauer stole home, to make the final 6-5.

Both teams made fine defensive plays. Black catcher Michael Charlton gunned down a runner trying to steal in the fourth, with third

baseman Levy applying the tag. Black's first baseman Tommy Norris made four putouts over three innings.

Silver third baseman Anthony Iacononi ranged far into foul territory to catch a pop up in the first, and first baseman Tim McGann snagged a line drive in the fourth to save a likely double off the bat of Norris.

Black's Head Coach Jeff Gerris commented, "The game was well played on both ends. It could have gone either way, I'm happy that, on this night, it fell in our direction."

Silver Head Coach Chris Flynn added, "It was great to see all these Westfield boys playing hard and having fun out there."
