Kidney Donor Sought for Husband, Father

KENILWORTH — Michael Capizzano, 45, of Kenilworth was diagnosed in his early 30s with an inherited disorder of polycystic kidneys in which fluid filled sacs form on both kidneys. The kidneys grow larger, but have less functioning tissue. Time is of the essence for Michael as the need for a new kidney is quickly becoming a dire situation with each passing day.

No one in the family is a suitable match and he will have to start dialysis if a kidney donor is not found. The life style for patients dependent on dialysis is usually bleak. Chances of a normal life greatly increase with a kidney transplant.

Michael has been on the transplant list for two years. The wait list for blood type O is more than five years. He is working with Allison McCabe, RN, BSN at the Transplant Center at

Robert Wood Johnson University hospital in New Brunswick.
Michael's spirit remains strong and his family is reaching out to the community in the hope that someone might be willing to donate a kidney to save Michael's life. Prospective donors would first need to have blood type O and would be required to go through further testing to make sure they are compatible. Michael's medical plan would cover any medical charges incurred by the donor.

Michael currently lives in Kenilworth with his wife, Renee, daughters, Michelle and Christine and son, James. He is involved in the town's recreation girls' basketball and softball teams.
