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over to Kurt Rutmayer and that really opened up our offense. He was great going to the basket, but he's got to develop a primary jump shot to open things up," Coach Huber said.

Senior forward/center Rutmayer could be deadly from the perimeter, as well as underneath with putbacks and rebounds. Rutmayer sank 20 3-pointers and finished with 266 points, which included 70 free throws. He also grabbed 122 rebounds and led the team with 10 blocked shots.

"Kurt is a consistent player in anything he does. Whether it's football, basketball or baseball, he is a great leader out there. He does everything you ask him to do. He does it without ever saying two words against it. He is going to be missed not only because of his basketball ability, but he is going to be missed just as much as a leader," Coach Huber said.

Senior point guard Sean Babos led the team with 71 assists, but despite his unselfishness, he managed to score 199 points, including 33 3-pointers and 42 free throws. He was the Cougars' chief thief with 14 steals.

"Sean! Once we got the ball in bounds, we didn't think many people were going to be able to take the ball away from him. Early in the season we thought we relied too much on Sean in terms of bringing pressure. I talked to him in the middle of January that he had to score a little bit more, and he really did that. Once he started shooting more, that really opened it up, because he's got range from 25 feet in," Coach Huber said.

Junior forward Stefan Fedorchak led the Cougars with 38 3-pointers (114 points), sank 89 2-pointers (178 points) and hit 38 free throws, which translated to 330 points. He also had 11 thefts and eight assists.

"He is going to be called upon next year to do even more. He was a little under the radar coming into this season, because he played JV as a sophomore. He's going to be a marked man next year by a lot of teams that are going to try to stop him and Reggie. I think he is the type of kid, who is going to work really hard and take it to the next level," Coach Huber said.

Senior guard Eric Garguilo got injured very early in the season, but junior Chris Wills filled in and contributed 69 points and seven assists.

"Coming into the season Chris was going to be our backup here, backup there. Unfortunately, we had a season-ending injury to Eric Garguilo. He was tossed into a role, and he did a very good job. He primarily guarded the other teams' best players," Coach Huber said.

Sophomore guards Tommy Trotter and John Oblachinski also found adequate time on the court and contributed 44 and 37 points, respectively.

"Both of them are going to be called upon to have big roles next year. Tommy is going to be there for Sean as our primary ball handler, and Johnny will take that spot vacated by Kurt. I am very confident with their work ethic that they will be able to handle that," Coach Huber said.
