Westfield Crew brought home 14 medals from the Long Island Junior Rowing Championships last Sunday. In a full day of 1500-meter sprint races on Oyster Bay, N.Y., Westfield's men and women rowers won bronze medals in four different sculling events.

The Women's Novice Quad of Logan Schwartz, Melanie Snyder, Helen Keating and Alex Colucci earned the first medals, followed by the Men's Novice Quad of Chip Pipala, Alex Schneider, Alex Zornitsky and Ben Howell.

This coming weekend Westfield Crew will participate in The Raritan Cup regatta, which is fast becoming a traditional showdown between Westfield Crew and St. Joseph's Prep of Metuchen. This year Rumson Fair Haven team will be joining the competition. Races will be held Saturday at the Rutgers University Boathouse on the Raritan River in New Brunswick.

Westfield won six more medals in the afternoon at the regatta hosted by the Sagamore Rowing Association on waters once rowed by a young Theodore Roosevelt.

On May 18-19, Westfield Crew will complete its spring 2012 season at the Stokesbury Cup Regatta in Philadelphia, the largest high school rowing regatta in the world.
