FSPY Swimmers Finish 43rd At 'Y' Short Course National

The Fanwood-Scotch Plains "Y" (FSPY) swim team finished 43rd out of 217 teams at the YMCA Short Course National Championship Meet at the Greensboro Aquatics Center from April 8-11. In individual events, Sarah Cronin finished eighth in the 100-free (50.97) and ninth in the 200-free (1:49.37), breaking team records in both events. Fourteen-year-old Monika Burzynski set team age group records in the 100-fly (56.92) and the 200-back (2:07.03). Joining Cronin and Burzynski on the 400-freestyle relay were Amanda Banasiak and Sarah Davis. Earning team points (top 16), this relay set a new team record (3:27.32), finishing 14th overall. Through their contributions on this relay, Banasiak and Burzynski earned the coveted black FSPY swim cap which is worn only at national cham-

ampionship finals. Joe Baron swam a personal best in 50-freestyle (21:26) and donning the black cap in the 'C' finals. Baron anchored the 200 and 400 Medley Relay events with Alex Skoog, Aidan Donadio and Tyler Lessner to set team records of 1:35.23 and 3:28.42, respectively. Participating at their first YMCA Short Course National Championship meet were Amanda Banasiak, Eric Chang, Greg James, Isabella Iacona, Rachel Maizes, Dan Myers and Julie Stankiewicz. Coach Chris Karelus was proud of the efforts of his departing seniors, glad that they were able to compete so effectively at their last Short Course National Championship meet and looks forward to the contributions of the team as they begin their spring and summer Long Course season.

Lawlessness Is Being Rewarded With a Pulitzer Prize

The Journalism School of Columbia University has awarded the Pulitzer Prize For Public Service to The Guardian and The Washington Post for their series of stories on electronic surveillance by the National Security Agency based upon the intelligence information leaks of the traitorous Edward Snowden! It is NOT a "public service" to aid and abet the theft of government property, the unauthorized communication of national defense information, the willful communication of classified intelligence information to unauthorized persons! 18 U.S. Code Section 2 (a) Whoever commits an offense against the United States or aids, abets, counsels, induces or procures its commission, is punishable as a principal. The legal process by which classified material may be released was short-circuited by Mr. Snowden because he took it upon himself all alone to determine what is "legal spying" (his "open letter to the people of Brazil", December 18, 2013). The Pulitzer Committee, in giving the prize, stated that the Guardian helped "through aggressive reporting to spark a debate about the relationship between the government and the public over issues and security and privacy". It said that The Washington stories were "marked by authoritative and insightful reports that helped the public understand how the disclosures fit into the larger framework of national security". Mr. Snowden and these two prominent newspapers in reporting the top national security material illegally obtained and illegally released by him have done considerable damage to our national security and have undermined any sense of public responsibility that the

media should have regarding national security! Relations with such important American allies as France, Mexico, Brazil, Spain, and Germany have become considerably strained. Vital intelligence work of the National Security Agency intended to protect us and our beloved country has been compromised. American operatives tremble that their identities may be revealed! His living in Putin's Russia deeply embarrasses the United States and humiliates the President and the Secretary of State. The warning during the Second World War was "A slip of the lip can sink a ship." But slips of lips do not concern either Mr. Snowden or The Guardian and The Washington Post! Or the Columbia University Journalism School! What next? That others may thus be encouraged to release top secret weapons development programs or top secret military strategies of the Pentagon? Reveal the innermost confidential negotiations of this or that President with some foreign head of state? Even release the top-secret names of American espionage agents? What lesson is this for a young generation that is taught that people do not violate the law! That they do not take it up themselves to do what they think right even if they break the law? That judicial channels must be followed? Is this not a formula for legal chaos? No foreign power or event abroad can ever defeat the United States of America. The threat is internal! What irony! That Mr. Snowden and his followers think that the American intelligence community is the true enemy of our freedoms and liberties and not Russia or Iran or North Korea! We cannot be or feel safer now that Mr. Snowden has broken the law by releasing all that classified information and The Guardian and The Washington Post by receiving and publishing it.
