## Westfield Library Presents Chinese-Language Collection

WESTFIELD — The Westfield Memorial Library has announced that it has a new Chinese-language collection available, made possible by a donation from Westfield resident Jin Chen and Lei Zhou. The library is located at 550 East Broad Street.

Housed on the second floor outside the Reference Office, the collection currently consists of 125 books that reflect current and classic fiction, mystery and non-fiction titles. Fiction includes some of the best-selling authors in China, such as Yan Geling and Mo Yan. The collection also includes books on Chinese history, politics, medicine and biography, plus popular titles such as "Steve Jobs" by Walter Isaacson, as well as the "Game of Thrones" trilogy by George R.R. Martin.

According to Mr. Chen, the drive to start a Chinese-language collection is due to the efforts of his son, William, a Westfield High School senior. In addition to spearheading this effort, he and Kelly Jiang, a junior at the Union County Magnet High School; Albert Chen, a Westfield High School junior, and Cindy Qian, a Westfield High School sophomore, recently raised \$218 to further the collection at a weekend gathering held at Tamaques Park.

Head of Adult Services Jen Schulze commented that the library will offer a large collection of various Chinese-language e-books as well in the near future. They will have similar themes such as fiction and mystery, cooking and health.

Jill Ji, co-founder of the Spring Academy in Garwood, also gave a \$500 check to Board of Trustees President Douglas Stokes to help the library expand the collection. The Spring Academy is a new school in Garwood that offers a 50-percent Montessori and 50-percent Chinese immersion program to children 2½ to 6 years old.

"We are pleased to be able to expand the library's collection to meet a need in the community that we could not have otherwise addressed," said Library Director Phil Israel. "We look forward to working with Mr. Chen and Mr. Zhou to help maintain and grow the collec-

tion."

Library hours are 9:30 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Friday and Saturday. The library is closed on Sundays until September 21.

WESTFIELD — The Westfield Area Y has announced that registration for the second annual Greta's Run 5K Run/Walk/Roll is now open. A USATF Certified event, Greta's Run will be held on Sunday, September 14, 2014.

The event was created by Jayne Ruotolo and Ben Nanna, childhood friends of Greta Shoememann, a Westfield High School freshman who died from injuries sustained on September 11, 2002. She was eating lunch with friends when a tree branch fell onto their table.

In its inaugural year, Greta's Run had 900 registered runners, 200-plus volunteers and an extraordinary show of community support. People of all abilities traveled from 11 states and Germany to participate on race day, with donations coming in from all over the United States, Europe and Canada. This local cause became a global event.

All proceeds benefit new and existing programs for people with special needs at the Westfield Area Y. Samplers have been held with proceeds of last year's event to gauge community need. Based on the success of the initial samplers, a second group of samplers has been scheduled for August and September and includes fitness classes, yoga classes and a social.

The Greta's Run starting line will be in front of the Westfield Area Y, 220 Clark Street in Westfield. Registrants by Tuesday, August 12, are guaranteed race shirts. Awards will be given to overall and age group winners. Participants will have a chance to win a BMW bicycle and other prizes. Refreshments will be served.
