Nothing seemed to go right and nearly nothing went in for the Westfield High School boys basketball team in a 48-45 loss to Governor Livingston at Westfield on January 28, just three days after beating the Highlanders, 45-36, on their turf.

Shooting percentages were quite low for both teams, especially in the first half, but the 4-9 Highlanders managed to sink one more 3-pointer than the 8-6 Blue Devils in the third quarter and added another in the fourth.

"It is tough to win games when you shoot 25 percent from the field. A lot

of those shots were in the paint too. The effort was there but the execution was lacking. When we got to the rim we had trouble finishing and when we took jump shots, some were good shots and some were forced," Blue Devil Head Coach Daryl Palmieri said.

Highlander Rob Imbalzano, who hit a pair of 3-pointers in the third quarter, led all scorers with 16 points, while teammate Pat Mahoney nailed a 3-pointer in the third quarter and added another in the fourth to finish with 10 points. John Iorio and Javon Reis-Wilson each bucketed six points, while John Wills and Vic Candeloro each scored four points and Chris

Marzo added two.

Senior Dylan Elliott led the Blue Devils with 12 points, including three 3-pointers, and three steals. He also had six rebounds, an assist and tipped a pass that ended up in the hands of a teammate. Senior Dave Kane had six rebounds, six points and a pair of steals. Chris Wright sank seven points, while adding five rebounds, a blocked shot and one steal. Chris Boutisikaris also had seven points, two rebounds, a steal and an assist. Junior Sean Elliott had six points, four rebounds, a steal and an assist.
