

WF RVL Matmen Outlast Bound Brook, Remain Perfect

The Westfield Raritan Valley League wrestling team kept its undefeated season intact with a 36-30 victory over Bound Brook, in Westfield on February 1. Last year, Bound Brook was the only team to defeat Westfield.

Westfield won six of the first seven bouts to take a 4-3 lead. Jayden Moore recorded a pin at 52 pounds. Next, Brian Jordan scored a 6-4 decision at 55-lbs, Luke Jordan won, 9-4, at 59-lbs and Jackson Jordan pinned in 0:25 at 72-lbs.

"The win by Luke Jordan exemplifies the depth of our team," noted coach Michael Price. "While Brian and Jackson are regulars in the lineup, Luke is our back up at 59lbs. We asked him to step into the starting lineup in the biggest match of the year and he really delivered. We have many examples of that on our squad, if called upon like Luke was today, they would deliver too."

Coach Price then moved Ethan Composto up to 62-lbs where he secured a 4-3 victory. "Our objective was to put strength on strength," added Price. "While we were asking a lot from Ethan, we knew he'd deliver the victory."

William O'Hagen closed out the opening charge with a 4-0 decision at 67-lbs. Bound Brook won the next six bouts to take a 27-24 lead.

"All year we've been winning by decisive margins," added Price. "We told the boys that some of our best wrestlers were going to lose today and that's ok. How we respond in a close match will really define our grit and our character."

James Greco responded at 100-lbs with a quick pin to give Westfield a 30-27 lead. Malachi Mercer then dropped a decision to an undefeated state champion, 12-7, knotting the score, 30-30.

"Malachi's match was critical. Giving up three years in age and experience, he fought hard." In fact, Mercer reversed his opponent to their back in the final seconds and almost secured a pin. "If there was ever a definition of a quality loss, that was it."

The match then came down to Tom Clancy, who brought home the victory with a pin at Heavyweight.

"Our entire team contributed to this win," said Price, "from the additions into the lineup to the intensity of our practices, each wrestler in that room can say they had a hand in today's victory."

Westfield will host Bridgewater and Hillsborough tomorrow.

Hess (2 assists, 3 rebounds) and Eric Shor (2 rebounds, blocked shot, steal) each had two points. Chris Sweeney had three rebounds.

Neither team could find the basket until Dylan Elliott sank his first 3-pointer with 6:30 left in the first quarter. Hess sank two free throws and Sean Elliott hit a 2-pointer to give the Blue Devils a 7-0 lead before a timeout was called with 5:08 on the clock. The Highlanders answered with a 9-2 run to knot the score entering the second quarter. The Blue Devils missed all three of their free throws during that 9-2 span, while the Highlanders managed to hit only one of four.

Both teams were still off the mark, but the Blue Devils were a little better at the line, hitting 5-for-7, and won the quarter, 11-10, for a 20-19, halftime lead.

GL's Mahoney banged a 3-pointer early in the third quarter, but Westfield responded with an 8-2 run, which included Elliott's second 3-pointer, to

stretch their lead to 28-24 midway through the quarter. Imbalzano's two straight 3-pointers staggered the Blue Devils and caused a timeout with 1:31 left, but by the end of the quarter, the Blue Devils were clinging to a 35-34 lead.

The lead plunged to a 40-35 deficit quickly when Mahoney sank a 3-pointer and Imbalzano was fouled while rolling in a lay-up and sank the free throw. Both teams took several minutes to add just four points to their total until another timeout was called with 58.26 on the clock.

The Blue Devils were forced to foul. Reis-Wilson went to the line and sank both free throws, stretching the lead to seven. Boutsikaris nailed a 3-pointer, Reis-Wilson sank two more free throws and Elliott sank his third 3-pointer. With 18.18 remaining, Mahoney went to the line, missed both free throws, got the rebound, was fouled and missed two more free throws to keep the Blue Devils alive with 5.86 left. The Blue Devils attempted to hit a 3-pointer in the final second but missed the mark.

"Governor Livingston does a great job of frustrating us by forcing us to play outside. Our game plan was to be aggressive against it and look to get some points in transition, but they did a great job of taking that away. We extended our lead to seven and we had a few possessions in a row that we let their best player get some open looks and get them back in the game. I give them credit for continuing to battle. We started playing with more urgency towards the end but it was too little too late," Coach Palmieri said.
