McKEARY, PACE, DeMARS BECOME 'CHIEF THIEVES'

Lady Cougar Cagers Muffle Kent Place Dragons, 45-8

Converting from not using hands during soccer season to becoming chief thieves played out very well in a 45-8 Cranford High School girls basketball team victory over the Kent Place Lady Dragons in the opening round of the Cougar Classic in Cranford on December 27.

In fact rebounds took a back seat to steals as the Cougars committed, at least, 26 acts of thievery, and three girls, who were members of last fall's very successful soccer team, seniors Mairead McKeary and Hannah DeMars, and sophomore Lindsey Pace accounted for more than half of them among the 10 Cougars, who managed to get involved in the act of thievery.

Due to the lopsidedness of the score, McKeary scored all eight of her points in the first quarter and rested a large portion of the remainder of the game, along with the other starters, to allow the entire bench to see action. McKeary, who had two assists, finished with four steals. DeMars, who had two points and two assists, swiped seven, and Pace pilfered three and added four assists. Senior guard Kerry Wischusen finished with five points and three steals, senior guard Sarah Ross also had three steals, two assists and five points, and junior Erin Meixner added a pair of steals and five points.

WF's Marcotullio Wins 800 at Drew Invitational

Westfield High School seniors Natalie Marcotullio and Gabby Stravach finished 1-2 in the 800-meters with respective times of 2:26.94 and 2:27.53, while Scotch Plains-Fanwood Raider Jessica Banasiak finished sixth with a time of 2:31.98 at the Drew Invitational on December 27.

Blue Devil Erica Fischer finished fourth in the 1,600 at 5:35.06, Jenna Helfand finished sixth in the 55-meter dash at 7.81 and Hannah Hawkins placed fifth in the high jump with a height of 4-8. Raider Tori Balianico placed fourth in the 400 at 1:04.05. The Raiders placed third in the sprint medley 4:35.82 and Westfield finished fourth in the 4x400 at 4:33.41. For the boys, Raider Ben Evans finished fifth in the 1,600 at 4:49.42 and Quincy Sanchez placed sixth in the 55-hurdles at 8.42.

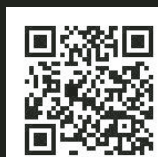

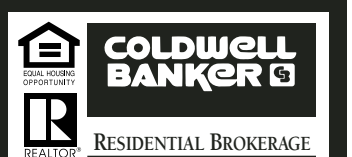
