I knew he had to come at me hard to get a takedown, but it was pretty sloppy," Velez said.

Looking to his bout with Hilburn, Velez said, "I wrestle everyone the same. Just because I am wrestling him, I am not going to change any-

thing. I am not going to change my style for anyone."

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Cougar Matmen Get Second At WRAL Invt'l Tournament

The Cranford High School wrestling team competed in the 42nd Annual WRAL Invitational Tournament in Raleigh, N.C. this past weekend. The Cougars entered 12 wrestlers and finished second out of the 35 teams participating.

Prior to the tournament, the Cougars were given permission to run their practice at the UNC Chapel Hill Olympic Training wrestling room, which would be a great experience for any high school wrestler.

Because the southern season started so early a lot of the wrestlers had close to 26 matches, which resulted in poor seeds for the Cougars. This set the stage for many higher seeded wrestlers to get toppled in the pre-quarterfinals by Cougars. In the end, three Cougars claimed championships.

Junior Gavin Murray knocked off two state placers on his way to capturing the 138-lb championship, 8-0. Freshman Tom Digiovanni knocked off the top seed early at 113-lbs and went on to decimate the remainder of his bracket taking home the championship with a 1-0 victory. At 120-lbs, freshman Chris Scorese pinned his way to the finals where he won an exciting, 9-6, match against a hometown favorite.

Freshman Anthony Capece lost a tough match in the 106-lb semis but wrestled back and dominated his third place match, 20-11. Sophomore Niko Cappello lost a tough match in the 160-lb semis and then wrestled back to a third place not giving up a single point in his final match, 5-0.

At 145-lbs, sophomore Andrew Tompkins wrestled tough, winning one match in overtime and bleeding his way to a respectable sixth place. At 152-lbs, senior Corey Birch placed fifth putting a punishing, 9-1, victory on his last opponent.

All Cranford wrestlers wrestled well and represented Cranford as gentlemen and classy competitive student athletes.
