## W-H Students Attend Model United Nations Conference

EDISON — In an effort to plan for the future of their world, 23 members of the Model United Nations club from The Wardlaw-Hartridge School (W-H) in Edison spent three days confronting the challenges of sustainable development. The conference took place from December 5-8 at the Heldrich Hotel on the Rutgers University New Brunswick campus. The trip was chaperoned by Tom Gilbert and Debbie Clifford.

Students participated in many different committees ranging from The Assembly on Disarmament and International Security, The International Atomic Energy Agency, The Commission on Science and Technology for Development, The United Nations Environment Program, and much more. The theme of the conference this year was "Sustainable Development" and students debated on many issues pertaining to this topic including nuclear energy, urban development, food security, resource efficiency, ethics of modern warfare and the digital divide.

During long days and far into the nights, students listened, argued, debated, and eventually voted on issues that could potentially shape their world. Students learned a great deal about the inner workings of the UN.

The W-H students compiled an overall debate score of 41/50, which is one of the highest scores our school

has ever received. "I was amazed at not only the large number of students that wanted to go on this trip but also the wide variety of the group in terms of age, experience, and interests," Divya Mehta of Edison said. "I think it really goes to show that Model UN is for anyone who cares about the world around them and is interested in making a difference. WESTFIELD — The Westfield Public School District will be registering children who will become eligible for kindergarten in the 2014-2015 school year. The district also is interested in locating children who have not attended the Westfield Public Schools for kindergarten, but will enter first grade in the fall.

"It is very helpful for the district to have this information so that we may effectively plan for every new child," stated Superintendent of Schools Margaret Dolan.

Parents may register children at the following schools on the dates and during the times indicated below by first calling for an appointment.

Required information and forms including Registration, Personal Health History and Medical Record forms are available on the district web site at [www.westfieldnj12.org/register](http://www.westfieldnj12.org/register). They are also available at the schools.

The requirements include: Birth certificate with raised seal from the Bureau of Vital Statistics; Proof of residence (utility bill, tax bill, lease, closing statement, voter's registration); Proof of Immunization (most recent record);

Diphtheria, Pertussis and Tetanus vaccine (DPT Series) - four doses with one dose given on or after the fourth birthday, or any total of five doses. Poliomyelitis

vaccine - three doses of oral polio-virus vaccine (OPV) or enhanced inactivated polio vaccine (IPV), with one dose given on or after the fourth birthday, or any four doses spaced by a minimum of one month. Rubeola (Measles) vaccine - two doses given on or after the first birthday separated by at least a month, or laboratory documentation of immunity. Rubella (German Measles) vaccine - one dose given on or after the first birthday, or laboratory documentation of immunity. Mumps vaccine - one dose given on or after the first birthday or laboratory documentation of immunity. Hepatitis B vaccine - three doses or laboratory documentation of immunity. Varicella vaccine - one dose of varicella vaccine on or after the first birthday or proof of disease or immunity is required for children 19 months of age or older who attend a child care center or are entering kindergarten or first grade.

Please note: State law will not permit any child to be admitted to a public school unless immunizations have been completed and documented by an M.D., D.O., or Nurse Practitioner, specifically indicating a day, month and year administered.

Entry Physical Examination Required: Only one entry examination is necessary on admission to Kindergarten or first grade (pre-K physical may be the entry physical). A five year physical exam is recommended.

For Pre-Kindergarten Students age 3 or older, you must present a physical exam, personal health history, and the above immunizations (age appropriate) record including: Pneumococcal Vaccine: age 2-11 months, two doses; age 12-59 months, one dose; Influenza Vaccine: age 6-59 months, one dose to be given between September 1 and December 31 of each year in pre-school; Haemophilus B age 2-11 months, 2 doses; age 12-59 months, one dose.

Should parents have any questions about the registration process, call one of the schools. In the event of a delayed opening or school closing due to inclement weather, registration for that day will be rescheduled.
