

MLK Day of Service Is Set In Scotch Plains-Fanwood

SCOTCH PLAINS — The Fifth Annual Martin Luther King Day of Service in Scotch Plains and Fanwood will take place this Monday, January 20. Sponsored by the communities of Scotch Plains and Fanwood, the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Ministerium, the Jewish Community Center (JCC) of Central New Jersey, the Fanwood-Scotch Plains YMCA and Nick's Pizza, this event will provide volunteer opportunities for the whole family.

Age-appropriate activities will be held throughout the two towns, from creating get-well cards for cancer patients to baking dog biscuits for animal shelters. Families can assemble healthy snacks for after-school programs and sandwiches for a local food

bank. Children also will have the opportunity to create a poster representing the legacy of Dr. King for submission to the National Martin Luther King Day of Service poster contest.

For the adult members of the family, there will be opportunities such as cleaning the local nature center, working at a nearby Habitat for Humanity site or participating in a roundtable discussion inspired by Dr. King. Those unable to donate their time that day can still give back by participating in the JCC's annual blood drive or by dropping off clothes, food or gently used toys through one of multiple donation opportunities.

MLK Day 2014 will kick off with an opening ceremony from 10 to 11 a.m. at the JCC of Central New Jersey, located at 1391 Martine Avenue in Scotch Plains. Guests will include Mayor Kevin Glover from Scotch Plains and Mayor Colleen Mahr from Fanwood. The program will begin with a "community values" art project and end with a brief musical program. All are welcome to attend.

Activities will begin immediately following the opening program and will be held throughout Scotch Plains and Fanwood between 11:15 a.m. and 5 p.m. Volunteers are invited to visit Nick's Pizza, located at 42 South Martine Avenue in Fanwood, between noon and 3 p.m. for a slice of pizza — half of all proceeds will benefit the MLK Day of Service and a local charity.

Although same-day registration will be available during the opening program, participants are strongly encouraged to register online as space is very limited and has filled up quickly in the past.
