Wardlaw-Hartridge Offers Parenting Workshop Series

EDISON — The Wardlaw-Hartridge School, in partnership with the Jewish Community Center, will hold its second in a three-part Parenting Workshop Series on Thursday, January 30, at 7 p.m. This segment — The Pressures or Pleasures of Play — investigates how to spend time with children in ways that are engaging and stimulating.

When we have the opportunity to spend time with our children, what do we do? Do we find “teaching

moments” or “bonding time?” Do we encourage our children to engage in activities that we think are good for them or that they find pure fun? How do we create experiences for our children that are pleasant and magical rather than pressured?

The community is invited to attend the event on January 30 and meet Cindy Terebush, a Professional Impact Specialist, who has dedicated herself to advising parents on how to find developmentally appropriate ways to play with their children.

Ms. Terebush has spent more than 15 years working in the field of education. She has experience teaching and directing in daycare, preschool and school-age programs. She is a New Jersey Approved Associate Instructor of Adults and author of the popular blog “Helping Kids Achieve with Cindy Terebush.”

Articles from her blog appear in the online news source *The Patch* throughout the State of New Jersey. She has facilitated workshops at the Brookdale Early Childhood Education Conference, the Commission for Jewish Education, the New Jersey Division for Early Childhood and during various in-service, parent workshop and adult education programs. She was the keynote speaker at the New Jersey Division for Early Childhood 2012 Annual Conference at Kean University and a presenter at the New Jersey Association for the Education of Young Children in Atlantic City.
