**BOROUGH OF GARWOOD BOARD OF HEALTH BOH ORDINANCE #1-2014 "SETTING LICENSING FEES FOR ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE ESTABLISHMENTS"**

**Section 1. Purpose.**  
The purpose of this ordinance is to license establishments that sell electronic smoking devices. The funds collected by licensing of such establishments shall be used to fund the Borough of Garwood's Tobacco Age of Sale Enforcement program and other smoking cessation, prevention or control programs.

**Section 2. Definitions.**  
For the purpose of this section, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this section clearly demonstrates different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number shall include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

**Board** shall mean the Garwood Board of Health

**Electronic Smoking Device** shall mean an electronic or other powered device that can be used to deliver nicotine or other substances to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an electronic cigarette, cigar, cigarillo, or pipe.

**Retail Electronic Smoking Device Establishment** shall mean any establishment that sells or offers for sale electronic smoking device products designed for consumption through inhalation.

**Sale** shall mean every delivery of electronic smoking devices, whether the same is by direct sale or the solicitation or acceptance of an order, including the exchange, barter, traffic in, keeping and exposing for sale, displaying for sale, delivering for sale, peddling and possessing with intent to sell.

**Section 3. Licensing Fees**  
A. No person shall conduct, maintain or operate an establishment that sells electronic smoking devices without first obtaining from this Board a license to do so.  
B. Fees in accordance with the following
