Vicki's 'Walks' by Autoland For Top Seed in B Division

Strategy of drawing the walk to score runs paid off big time in the fifth inning for Vicki's, who rolled to a 14-13 win over Autoland in Scotch Plains Men's Softball League Monday Division action at Jerseyland Field in Scotch Plains on July 21. Vicki's victory awarded them the top seed for the upcoming playoffs.

Vicki's totaled 12 free passes and nine of them came in that fifth inning, along with six singles as 12 Victorians were permitted to dance across home plate. At the time, Autoland was boasting an 8-2 lead.

Brandon Cuba had three of Vicki's 13 hits in his four plate appearances. Cuba, who finished with two RBI and

a run scored, was one of only two Victorians, who refused to wait for a walk. The other, Mookie Fronzak, went 1-for-2 with two RBI and a sacrifice fly.

Rich Banasiak (2-for-2, 2 RBI, 2 runs) was willing to wait for a pair of walks as was Al Genova (1-for-2, 2 runs) and pitcher Carlos Rego (1-for-2, RBI, 1 run). Pat Peterpaul poked a pair of singles, scored twice and added an RBI. Pete Corvello singled, scored twice and had an RBI. Mike Petrone singled, had two RBI and scored once. Al Dente (single), Jason Hoynowski (RBI) and Alberto Cortez each scored once.

Dave Belford was the "Sultan of Swat" for Autoland with a colossal two-run home run and an RBI single

to go with his other single. Brian Schiller smacked a two-run triple, singled and scored once. Angelo Richichi ripped three singles, scored twice and had an RBI. Jay Everitt rapped a two-run double and scored once. John Lyp singled twice, scored three and had two RBI. Doug Delle Donne (RBI, run) and Dom Centanni each had two singles. Kyle Adams (RBI, run), Billy Mariani (2 runs) and Steve Barba (run) each singled.

Autoland revved up its engines and scored four runs in the bottom of the first. Delle Donne and Belford ripped RBI singles and Everitt drilled his two-run double to center. Corvello and Fronzak both lofted an RBI sac fly to score Genova and Peterpaul,
