SP-F School District Preschool Registration is Ongoing

SCOTCH PLAINS-FANWOOD - The Scotch Plains-Fanwood School District is still accepting applications for preschool for the 2014-2015 school year. The Preschool Program uses the Creative Curriculum, which fosters children's learning through exploration and discovery. Preschool classes are comprised of general education students and students with special needs, as determined by a district evaluation. Applicants must be residents of Scotch Plains or Fanwood. Proof of residency status and an original birth certificate will be required for new students enrolling in the program.
