## CHS Coach Bonitatis Signs Mixed Martial Arts Contract

Justin Bonitatis, a Health and Physical Education teacher and assistant wrestling coach at Cranford High School, recently signed a mixed martial arts contract with Cage Fury Fighting Championships. Bonitatis will enter his first professional mixed martial arts match on Saturday, June 21, at the Mennen Sports Arena in Morristown for Cage Fury Fighting Championships 36. Bonitatis, age 26, attended Cherry Hill High School East (CHE) from 2002-06, compiling a scholastic wrestling record of 125-20. Wrestling runs

in the Bonitatis bloodline as his father, Ronnie, was a two-time district wrestling champion for CHE in the 1970's.

Bonitatis attended The College of New Jersey where he compiled a 138-16 record at 165 pounds, setting the second highest wins total in school history. At TCNJ he captured three conference championships, was a three-time NCAA Tournament qualifier, two-time NCAA All-American and two-time NCAA Scholar All-American.

At Cranford as assistant wrestling coach, Bonitatis earned the honor of Assistant Coach of the Year in District 11 after just his third year.

For the past two years, Bonitatis has been training at Allstar Brazilian Jiu Jitsu under head professor, professional boxer and second Degree Renzo Gracie BJJ Black Belt Jamal Patterson. He also has discipline under Damion Logan and Matthew Wernikoff, head coach and owner of Apex Wrestling School and assistant manager and strength and conditioning coach of Champion Athletes, respectively.
