## Westfield PAL 'B' Defeats Sparta Grid Kids, 26-22

The Westfield PAL "B" football team continued its early season winning ways with an impressive, 26-22 victory over Sparta in a rematch of last season's Superbowl.

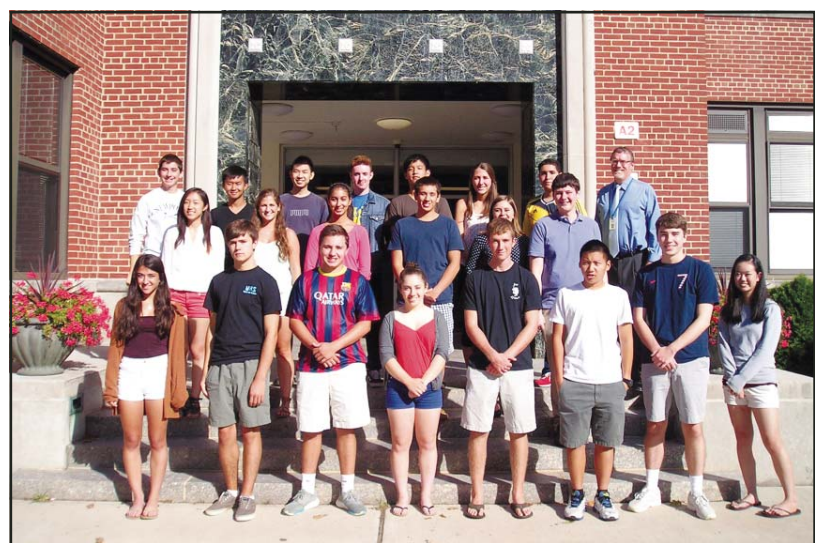
The Blue Devils started quickly and jumped out to a 14-0 lead on TD runs by Hank Shapiro and Timmy Alliegro, and an extra point by Justin Chambliss. The scoring drives were set up by combination of running and passing plays, including a 50-yard catch and run by Griffin Rooney, and a 12-yard catch by Henry Meiselman. Sparta answered later in the first half, and led 16-14 at the break.

In the third quarter, the Westfield defense recovered a fumble and the offense quickly capitalized with Alliegro catching a screen pass and

then darting 25 yards through the Sparta defense for a TD. The Blue Devils would add another touchdown on a terrific 65-yard run by Alliegro, behind some great blocking from the offensive line, which played well all day and included Bryan Felter, Declan McCauley, Jonny Audino, Sean Link, Joe Muselli and Matt O'Connor.

The victory was sealed when Colin Elliott intercepted a pass late in the fourth quarter and returned it 50 yards. The defense came up with big plays throughout the game with Colin Freer, Reid Colwell, Nick Martini, Doug Moore, Max Gigantino, and Ryan Smith all recording tackles or sacks.

Next up for Westfield will be a home game against a tough squad from Morristown.
