 is a fiery combination of calculating, murderous clarity and lunacy.
 Memorable duets run throughout the show. In the ironic duet "Pretty Women" while adversaries Todd and Judge Turpin (played menacingly by Walter Zimmerman) rhapsodize about females in general, the pompous judge doesn't realize that Sweeney and he are singing about the same girl.
 Johanna (Kate Pfuhler), the ward of the lecherous judge, delights us with "Green Finch and Linnet Bird." Ms. Pfuhler's beautiful face and incredible voice produce the innocent essence of Johanna. Her would-be lover/rescuer Anthony (the gifted Matthew De Marco) regales her praises in the hauntingly gorgeous presentation of, "Johanna." On the heels of these solos the frenetic duet "Kiss Me" showcases both voices.
 A much overlooked role is that of the Beggar Woman (Laura De Santis) which requires not only a versatile voice but fine acting skills. Ms. De Santis owns the part.
 Only eight people are listed as the ensemble. Those powerful voices, however, sound like an army of musicians. The outstanding quintet and trio know their harmonies well.
 The comic relief is the role of Pirelli (Jeffrey Fiorello) with his "Miracle Elixir." The set-up song is Toby's with his adorable hawking the watery shoe polish as a hair tonic. Clad in an outlandish plaid suit, cape and plumed hat, Pirelli is an egotistical hoot with his grand flourishes and flounces. Mr. Fiorello stops the show with his humorous Italian accent followed by an Irish brogue. Mr. Fiorello's falsetto is flawless. He, along with Christine Hahn, has pulled off a costume plot to die for, literally.
 And although masked and not noted in the program, Mr. Fiorello just might have been the wonderful male dancer in another scene with unnamed dancer Raven Alexandra Dunbar. Megan Ferentinos' expressive choreography is showcased in noteworthy spots.
 A superior orchestra, led by keyboardist Jack Bender, is nicely nestled upstage hidden by the all-encompassing set. The sound that the orchestra produces - from spooky organ music to full out percussion-laden rock - belies the fact that there are only seven members.
 "Sweeney Todd" is nothing like traditional musicals, so expect to be amazed at the operatic talent in the theatre that is amateur in name only.
