

# Imagine Event Today to Look At Grief, Decreasing Violence

SUMMIT — Imagine will present a Lunch and Learn program entitled "Expressing Grief, Decreasing Violence" today, Thursday, September 11, from noon to 2 p.m. It will take place at MONDO, located at 426 Springfield Avenue in Summit. Mary Robinson, founder and executive director of Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss, and Connie Palmer, a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and Imagine training director, will facilitate this community discussion.

"The mission of Imagine is to support children and adults coping with loss and foster resiliency and emotional well-being for all those who grieve," said Ms. Robinson. "We imagine a world where grief and loss are transformed into resilience, empathy and compassion and where children coping with loss grow up emotionally healthy and able to lead meaningful and productive lives. We are currently providing support for 204 children and adults from 45 New Jersey towns every two weeks and have provided training and education for over 2,050 teachers, parents, coaches, youth and other adults this year alone."

"Our goal in being part of these community conversations is to create 'good mourning' communities by normalizing grief and death and dying and decreasing the fear and discomfort surrounding these issues," said Ms. Palmer. "We want to bring the healing culture of Imagine out

into our communities. A lot of the violence and other acting out behavior we see in our society is often a result of unresolved grief from childhood. Our goal at Imagine is to provide support at the time of the loss so that it doesn't stay buried inside only to show up years later in unhealthy and destructive ways."
