

LAWRENCE GETS 100TH HIT VS PIONEERS

Blue Devils Blast Elizabeth, Rout Somerville Pioneers

The Westfield High School softball team improved to 3-0 with a 16-10 triumph over the hosting Elizabeth Minutemen on April 3 then one day later in Somerville, senior Erica Lawrence recorded her 100th career hit when the Blue Devils ransacked the Pioneers of Somerville, 20-5, in five innings.

Lawrence, who went 3-for-5 with a double, two RBI and two runs scored, got hit No. 100 when the Blue Devils scored in the top of the first inning against the Pioneers. Alivia Macaluso tripled, doubled, scored four times and had two RBI. Genevieve Howell went 4-for-4 with two RBI and two runs scored. Kalea Calugay, who did the pitching, rapped a pair of triples, singled, scored three times and had two RBI.

Blue Devil Julia Gagliardi singled, scored once and had an RBI. Emma Pietrewicz cracked two doubles, tripled, scored three runs and knocked in four runs. Molly Stogner singled twice, scored twice and had an RBI. Julia Romano walked twice and scored once. Emily Su and Emily Wistner

each singled, scored once and had an RBI. Michaela Hobson had an RBI single and Megan Prasek walked and scored once.

Blue Devils Beat BrH2O, 3-2; Fall to Delbarton, 3-2, in Tennis

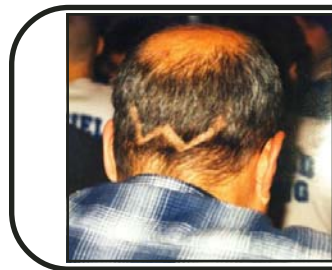

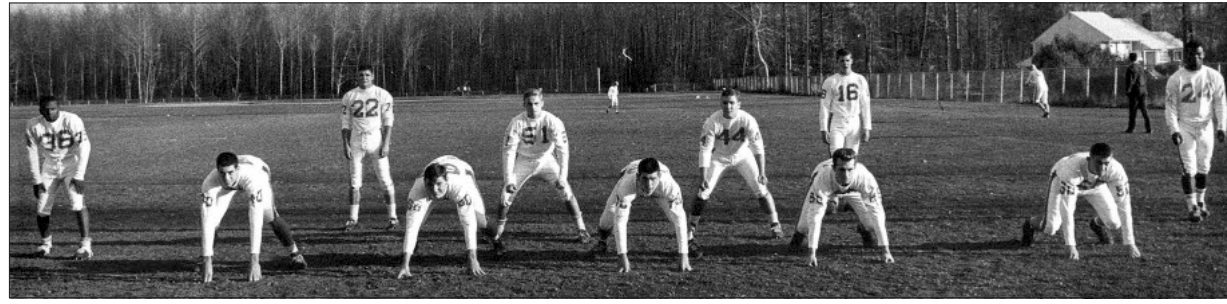

The 1960s: The Decade WHS Took Off: 1965

Sixth in a 10-part series

The 1960s were, take your pick, a decade:

1-of promise and heartbreak; 2-of counterculture and/or anti-establishment;

3-of change: the civil rights movement, the Vietnam War, the women's movement, human sexuality, environmentalism;

4-that has refused to die.

Maybe it was all of the above. As a '60s survivor, let's just say, "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times."

But, as the decade headed into its second half (1964-65), sports at Westfield High School was "the best of times" ... as the Blue Devils' 10 varsity sports all had exceptional years. In fact, from the 1959-60 school year through 1964-65, WHS's varsity teams had compiled 53 winning seasons out of 56.

Cross-country: Coach Walt Clarkson's carriers came very close to a second-straight "perfect" year - finishing 9-0 in dual meets, winning the Watchung Conference, and then coming in second at the county, sectional and state championships. Senior co-captain Ken Robinson was usually the top finisher.

Football: For the second time in

three years, coach Gary Kehler's squad went 7-1-1, losing an unbeaten season on Thanksgiving morning. Still, the Rudy Brown- and Jim Minno-captained Devils won the Watchung Conference and finished ranked No. 12 in the state. Linebacker Jerry Hendershott and tackle Steve Hoppin made all-state, and Brown was all-county.

Soccer: The booters went 8-3-3 under coach Bjarne Tonneson, led by senior all-stars Jim Boates and Nick Delmonico.

Basketball: First-year coach Bob Sanislow's team went 16-7 and captured the Union County Tournament - the last one in program history. Seniors Bob Felter (484 points), Steve Wright (307), Jerry Richards and Pete Mavraganis led the team, who also got a spark from sophomore Bobby Flynn. Felter had 35 points and 24 rebounds in the UCT semis against Scotch Plains, two weeks after going for 35 against Linden.

Swimming: The greatest team in program history (for at least another 12 months) went 10-1, losing only to the Princeton University freshmen on the final event, and winning county, Eastern Interscholastic and state championships. Coach Joe Della Badia's boys won all 11 events at counties, six of 11 at Easterns (including a 1-2-3-4 finish in diving), and seven of 11 at states.

Wrestling: Gary Kehler's squad went 10-2, winning the Montclair Invitational and sharing District 7 honors with Scotch Plains. Despite a weakness in the lower weights after 98-pound state runner-up Dave Wight (18-3-1), the team always finished strong with Jeff Thiel (14-4-1 at 136), Dave Wahl (12-4-2), Ron Hall (12-3-1), Mike Monninger (10-8-1), captain Jim Minno (19-1), Jim Deichert (16-2-1) and Doug Lang (12-5).

Baseball: With captain Greg Chlan seemingly on the mound every game, the Devils went 19-8, falling in the finals of both the Union County (to Union) and Greater Newark (Parsippany) tournaments. (For the second of four straight years, Koury chose not to enter the state tournament.) Chlan pitched 103 1/3 innings, struck out 130 and went 11-3.

Golf: Gary Kehler's linksmen went 14-1, winning the Union County Tournament, but finishing second in the conference and out of the running at District 2. Captain Bill Mammen was usually the top finisher.

Tennis: Sam Bunting's illustrious 25-year career ended with an 18-2 record. Again there were no team scores at counties, but captain Phil Grant lost in the singles final, and Bill Anderson and Doug Squires won the doubles. For the fourth straight year, WHS lost to Mountain Lakes, this time in the state semifinals.

Track: Coach Walt Clarkson's guys went 9-1 but it was an otherwise off-year. They were sixth at counties, second at the conference, eighth at sectionals and seventh in Group 4. The season's highlight was ending Scotch Plains's 50-meet win streak by a 58 2/3 to 58 1/3 score. Pete Mavraganis led a 1-2-3 finish in the broad jump to pull it out.

Record: 120 wins, 26 losses, four ties; two conference, three county, one district and one state title. Next: 1966

ALL-TIME LEADER Senior Devon McLane last week became the all-time scoring leader for the WHS boys lacrosse program. With 98 career goals and 119 career assists for 217 points, he passed previous leader Rob Schmalz ('86), who had 118 career goals and 93 career assists.

With games against Pingry (Tuesday) and Chatham (today), the Brown University commit likely became the first player in program history with 100 career goals and 100 career assists. He was just eight assists behind career leader Joey Simone ('07).

That's even more impressive when you consider the strength of WHS's schedule, and also that the program has produced 17 All-Americans, including Westfield Athletic Hall of Famers Dan Gilday, Rob and Gregg Schmalz, Chris Wojcik, Mike Baly and Steve Locker.

100-HIT CLUB Fourth-year softball starter Erica Lawrence came into her senior year with 93 career hits. It only took two games and one at-bat in the third game for her to reach 100 last Thursday against Somerville. The Saint Joseph's University-bound catcher joins seven former Blue Devils with 100-plus hits: Julie Criscuolo 152, Cali Chambliss 147, Cyndil Matthew 130, Chrissy Ferraro 120, and Kim Kumpf, Susan Phillips and Mary Kate Flannery all with 107.

The softball team is also closing in on 800 wins in program history, coming into this year with 792 since the team was formed in 1974.

FIRST 'W' AWARDS After Saturday morning's nine-inning, 8-4 loss to Somerville, the WHS baseball team is 0-3, with games this week against Cranford (Tuesday), Scotch Plains (today) and Clark (tomorrow). Oh-and-three starts are rare at WHS, although the 2016 team opened with losses to Scotch Plains, Cranford and Bridgewater-Raritan ... and finished 22-6!

'Y' NATIONALS Abby McKinney swam a 57.04 butterfly at YMCA Nationals last week in North Carolina. It doesn't count as a WHS school record because it was a Westfield "Y" competition, but it does put school record holder Anna Fetter's 57.34 in 2011 on notice. The WHS junior also swam a 52.66 leading off the 4x100 free relay, which would have been the No. 4 all-time 100 freestyle clocking at WHS; a 24.41 leadoff leg on the 4x50 free relay, which would also be No. 4; and a 1:54.40 leadoff leg on the 4x200 relay, which would have been No. 5.

KEEPING UP WITH ... Ken Marsh ... is in his 19th season as the boys lacrosse coach at Ridge High. His current squad is 4-0 and ranked No. 5 in the state by nj.com. Marsh ('90) was a three-sport standout at WHS, co-captaining the football and wrestling teams, along with lacrosse. Marsh came into this season with a 234-120 record. His teams have won two Somerset County Tournaments, a state title in both Group 3 (2010) and Group 4 (2013), plus one Tournament of Champions winner in 2013. He has served as an assistant football and wrestling coach, and was co-head wrestling coach for a couple of years. Ridge reportedly 'lost' to WHS in a March 23 scrimmage, but the teams won't meet again unless there is a match-up in the state tournament.

Marsh's Red Devils have faced the Blue Devils 11 times in-season, winning seven - including the 2013 sectional final.

ON THIS DATE 1963: Jeff Torborg (WHS, 1959) hit two home runs as Rutgers beat Glassboro 15-4 ... Tom Clements ('56) was among the 129 who died when the U.S. atomic submarine Thresher sank in the Atlantic Ocean. AROUND THIS DATE April 10, 1964: Frank Spaziani threw a no-hitter as host Clark opened the season with a 3-0 victory over WHS. "Spaz" walked seven and struck out 11, out-dueling Greg Chlan, who allowed six hits.

April 10, 2010: WHS beat New York City's Monsignor Farrell, 7-0, at Richmond County Bank Ballpark on Staten Island. In what is believed to be WHS's first-ever out-of-state baseball game, Rob Anderson pitched a two-hitter and contributed to a double and triple, while AJ Murray had three RBI.

April 13, 2005: Alex Zierler slugged two grand-slam home runs in a 17-16 loss to Bridgewater-Raritan. Mike Diaz tied the school record with three doubles.

home to earn the Cougars a 6-5 victory.

"I saw that Marcus tied the game bottom of seven, so I was looking to score the run no matter what.
