**Raiders Battled Consistency; Finished 12-8-3 in Boys Soccer**

Consistency problems primarily due to injuries may not have allowed the Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School boys soccer team to enjoy as successful a season as desired. But nevertheless the Raiders did have a good share of success by competing in the Union County Tournament (UCT) semifinals in addition to advancing to the North Jersey, Section 2, Group 4 championship game and finishing with a 12-8-3 record.

Interestingly, four of the Raiders' losses were to the No. 3 ranked Elizabeth Minutemen, who finished 20-1-4, and whose only loss was a 3-2 setback to No. 1 Clifton in the Group 4 semifinal game. The two regular-season losses to the Minutemen were 2-0 and 2-1, respectively. The third loss was 3-2, double overtime in the UCT semifinals and the fourth was 1-0 for the sectional crown.

In that UCT semifinal against the

Minutemen, the Raiders overcame a 2-1, halftime deficit on an early goal by senior Ryan Widman. From there, the Raiders dominated play and had the lion's share of opportunities but were unable to convert. The sectional championship game had another twist of bad luck for the Raiders when Minuteman Emiliano Caballero was awarded a penalty kick and converted the only goal of the game. That scenario seemed to come into play throughout the entire season.

Raider Head Coach Tom Breznitsky, whose career win/loss/tie record rose to 761-185-63, commented, "I always tell my teams you need three things to be successful. 'You have to be good, you have to be lucky and you have to stay healthy.' Two of them bit us in our losses, half through injuries. That didn't allow us consistency due to constant lineup changes. We never got into a smooth form."

Faith [Dobosiewicz] was also instrumental in that but a freshman being able to withstand our defensive concept and really just playing with toughness and heart for their teammates is what was one of the nicest things that we had," Coach McKeon said.

Others who received adequate playing time last year are senior Caroline Dwyer and juniors Charlotte Dursee and Emma Pietrewicz. Last year Dwyer, who sank the deciding 3-pointer in Game 2 against Roselle Catholic, finished with 101 points (17 3-pointers), 44 rebounds, 16 assists and 17 steals. She also scored 13 points in a win over the Oak Knoll Royals. Dursee finished with 94 points, 37 assists (3rd on team), 30 rebounds and was second on the team with 45 steals. Pietrewicz finished with 37 points, 13 assists, 10 rebounds and three steals.

The Lady Blue Devils, who will face Roselle Catholic twice during the regular season, open their season at home against Elizabeth on Thursday, December 19, at 4 p.m. then on Saturday, December 21, they will host Montgomery at 12:30.
