In May 1950, Rick McGinley's senior essay was a "History of Football in Westfield."

McGinley noted in the preface: "It shall be the purpose of this paper to consolidate the history of the sport of football in the Westfield High School since 1911. The paper is a result of a search of the files of The Westfield Leader over a period of 38 years. It is the desire of the author that his paper may serve as background material for the future sports editors of the *Hi's Eye* and will prove of interest to the students in the school.'

He acknowledged the assistance of Walter Lee, The Leader's owner/editor; Graham Beckel, a teacher at the high school who suggested the topic; and WHS football coach Joe Freeman, who helped him compile the

In his outline, McGinley went over many things, among them:

Before the high school formed a team (believed to be in 1897), some locals represented Westfield on Clark Field, located on East Broad Street, between Harrison and Euclid avenues.

Traditional games with Cranford caused ill feeling between the two

Home games were played at Recreation Park, which is now the center of outdoor sports in town and is known as Recreation Field (now it's Gary Kehler Stadium).


