WAYVE Teen Found. Board Seeks Grant Applicants

WESTFIELD — Rachel Simpson and Ryan Smith, co-chairs of the WAYVE Teen Foundation Board, have announced that the board is accepting requests for proposals that will provide Union County-based charities with over \$6,000 in grant awards for the proposals chosen by the board. The deadline for submissions is Monday, April 22, 2019. The grant awards will be announced on Monday, May 20.

The Westfield Area Youth Volunteer Experience (WAYVE) is made possible through a grant from the Westfield Foundation and is coordinated by Jewish Family Service of Central New Jersey (JFSCNJ), a non-profit, non-sectarian health and social service agency that serves all residents of Union County.

"There are so many deserving non-profits in our community where our friends and family donate their money and time, and it's satisfying to be involved in the funding of these great organizations," added Ryan Smith.

The WAYVE Teen Foundation Board will be mentored by Tom Beck, executive director of JFSCNJ; Anne Marie Puleio, executive director of The Fred C. Rummel Foundation, and Danielle Walsh, Westfield community leader.

The grant requests will range from \$500 to \$1,500 and are for a one-time, short-term project. The grants are designed to support programs that address needs that will improve the lives of Union County residents. The focus areas are: food insecurity, technology/equipment, environmental, social service and advocacy for impoverished and/or vulnerable populations. Proposals need to demonstrate how the program will promote the health and social well-being of the agency's constituents. Applicant agencies must be non-profit organizations with proof of 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status, have strong board involvement and demonstrate responsible financial stewardship. The board will not award funds to individuals for scholarships, or for agencies located out of Union County.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 2128

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE LAND USE ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD PERTAINING TO THE COMMERCIAL USE OF ROOFTOPS

WHEREAS, periodic update of allowable uses and regulations pertaining to them within non-residential zone districts is desirable to help promote economic development and sustainability in Town; and

WHEREAS, the commercial use of rooftops allows for businesses to provide an open-air amenity for its employees, customers, or visitors; and

WHEREAS, allowing the commercial use of rooftops as a conditional use within the Central Business District Zone District enables a land use board to review the development proposal prior to establishment; and

WHEREAS, the playing of music, whether live or recorded, and/or presence of television or video screens or displays is a desirable amenity for rooftop uses including rooftop dining areas, and should be permitted with proper regulation; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council does hereby further find that the public interest of the Town of Westfield will be served by amending the Land Use Ordinance of the Town of Westfield in the manner set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield, in the County of Union and the State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION I. Article 18, Section 18.24, Subsection D. entitled "Electronic visual displays; sound and amplification," is hereby deleted in its entirety. The existing subsection E shall be re-lettered as subsection D.

SECTION II. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any part of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION III. In the event that any section, provision, or part of provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unenforceable or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unenforceable or invalid.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication in the manner provided by law.

Joe Nolan to Give First Talk In 12th Hale Speaker Series

WESTFIELD — With four decades of traffic reporting to his name, former Westfield resident Joe Nolan will give the initial address in the 12th annual Hale Speaker Series.

In a talk entitled "Holy Trinity to Heavy Traffic," to take place Wednesday, March 20, Mr. Nolan will describe his career, including his current work with iHeartRadio. He is on the air at 77WABC, NASH-FM with Kelly Ford and KTU with Cubby Bryant and Carolina Bermudez.

Mr. Nolan, who moved recently from Westfield to Mountainside, also owns New Jersey Internet Radio that does play-by-play of high-school sports on its website. In addition, he is the public address announcer for the New York Jets and Rutgers University football. From 1992 to 2017, he reported on traffic for WPLJ/CBS with Scott Shannon.

A graduate of the former Holy Trinity High School in Westfield, Mr. Nolan honed his broadcasting skills at the campus radio station at Seton Hall University when he was an undergraduate there.

The hour-long talk starts at 7 p.m. in the Meeting Room of the Westfield Memorial Library, located at 550 East Broad Street. The
