“Rebuilding the Hudson Tunnels is of vital importance to my home district and our state,” Mr. Bucco

said. “Federal funding must be a priority. I urge Senators Menendez, Booker and Congresswoman Sherill to work with the administration to get funding for the tunnel as Congressman (Rodney) Frelinghuysen had done in the past.”

The President's proposed 2020 budget, rolled out Monday, includes no funding for the \$13.5-billion project and cuts the amount of funding for Amtrak's Northeast Corridor that could be used to start it.

Bill Requires Reporting Firework-Related Injuries

TRENTON – With increased access to fireworks, New Jersey residents are more at risk for injury. The Assembly Homeland Security Committee advanced legislation Monday, sponsored by Assemblyman Anthony M. Bucco, a member of the State Fire Commission, requiring the reporting of firework-related injuries.

The bill, A-4540, would require hospitals and clinics to report firework-related injuries to the state fire marshal in the Department of Community Affairs. It also requires the marshal to provide an annual report by each county and type of firework. It's modeled on a similar law for injuries caused by firearms.

“There has been an explosion of sales as a result of lifting the ban on some fireworks,” Mr. Bucco said. “As more people are using them, we need to know how many more injuries are caused. Otherwise, we will never know the exact statistics.”

New Jersey had been among less than a handful of states with a blanket ban — not counting approved public displays — but it modified the law in 2017 to allow “non-explosive, non-aerial fireworks,” such as sparklers and party poppers.

The products which are now legal are not risk-free. Sparklers can reach
