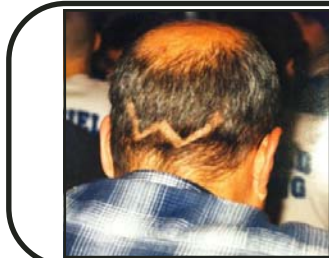

Pretre Is the New Colgate Swim Coach

Ed Pretre continued his climb up the ladder as a swim coach when he recently was named the head man at Colgate University, a Division I program in Hamilton, N.Y.

"Animal Ed" was co-captain of the 1992 WHS team that ended the 12-year reign of St. Joseph (Metuchen) as state champions. He won two individual races and was on two winning relays that night at Trenton State College.

After swimming collegiately at West Virginia, he began his coaching career at the Fanwood-Scotch Plains YMCA (1998-2005). That's where he gave early notice to being strong in

50 goals AND have 50 assists in the same season. He earlier set career marks for points, goals and assists. Classmate Jake Engelke had seven goals that game, surpassing the 100 career points mark.

Senior goalie Mallory Weisse ('15) was named Most Valuable Player in the Big Ten Tournament after making 10 saves as Northwestern (15-4) stunned No. 1-ranked and previously unbeaten Maryland 16-11 in the championship game. Weisse is a four-year starter for the Wildcats, playing every game the first two years. She was also a four-year starter at WHS, where she still holds the school record for career saves (790).

Mallory is the younger sister of former Dartmouth standout Courtney Weisse ('13), who is WHS's leader in career assists (121) and No. 2 all-time in goals (196) and points (317). In those last two categories, Courtney's classmate Elizabeth Cusick, who played collegiately at Stanford, is the leader.

Pretre later made coaching stops at Princeton, Rutgers, East Carolina, Truman State and most recently at Villanova.

His teams have done nothing but get better, and usually very quickly. Take his stint as the head coach at Truman State, a tiny Division 2 program in Kirksville, Mo. He led the Bulldogs to the conference championship, upsetting the No. 2-ranked team in the country.

"We searched for a head coach who was thoughtful, driven, enthusiastic, cohesive and bold," Colgate Director of Athletics Dr. Nicki Moore told reporters. "We believe we've found that coach in Ed Pretre. In addition to being a wonderful person, Ed's experience as a head coach, his experience at strong academic institutions, and his experience winning championships position him to lead our program with great integrity and success."

As Villanova's assistant coach the last two years, Pretre mentored a pair of Big East Conference Swimmers of the Year; the men's team had its highest conference finish (second) since 1993, while the women won their sixth straight title.

"I'm honored to be coaching the Colgate University swim teams, and I look forward to coaching exceptional student-athletes," Pretre said. "Colgate has a history of success and tradition. I look forward to acting upon every opportunity to make this program even better."

"This will be our home for the next 20, 25 years."

Baseball: Sparked by a 9-3 putout at first base (Chris Ho to Danny Kohler), the Brew Crew (8-11) won and advanced in the sectional tournament by beating Union 4-2. They'll visit top-seeded Bayonne today.

Boys lacrosse: In last week's state tournament opener against Columbia, senior Devon McLane scored three goals and seven assists, giving him 104 points this season. That breaks the old mark of 99 set 33 years ago (1986) by Rob Schmalz. McLane also became the first Blue Devil to score

Softball: After beating Roselle Park twice (11-1, 3-2) during the season, the WHS girls lost 7-1 to the Panthers in the Union County Tournament championship game. But the WHS junior varsity team captured the UCT jayvee tournament with a 13-5 romp over Berkeley Heights. Juniors Jess Schlewitt and Regan Schultz unloaded over-the-fence home runs for coach Jim McKeon's team, which lost only to Colonia. It was the jayvee's second straight UCT title, winning last year under Daryl Palmieri.

The top-seeded girls (20-2) beat Union 10-5 on Monday, and will host fifth-seeded Columbia in today's sectional semifinals. The Cougars stunned No. 4 Bayonne, the first team to beat WHS this spring.

Boys tennis: The boys 'upset' top-seeded Ridge, 3-2, on Monday to win their 30th sectional title, and fifth in a row. It was also the 1,199th coaching victory for George Kapner (all sports combined). After losing at first and second singles, and dropping the first set in two other matches, the Devils (21-4) rallied for three-set wins at No. 3 singles (Sebastian Wroe) and No. 2 doubles (Justin Cafiero and Irving Zhao).

BOND ORDINANCE STATEMENT AND SUMMARY

The bond ordinance, the summary terms of which are included herein, has been finally adopted by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, on May 21, 2019, and the 20-day period of limitation within which a suit, action or proceeding questioning the validity of such ordinance can be commenced, as provided in the Local Bond Law, has begun to run from the date of the first publication of this statement. Copies of the full ordinance are available, at no cost and during regular business hours, at the Clerk's office for members of the general public who request the same. The summary of the terms of such bond ordinance follows:

TITLE: BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLES, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$4,760,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO APPROPRIATE CAPITAL SURPLUS, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

The purposes, appropriations and bonds/notes authorized in this multipurpose bond ordinance are as follows:

SCHEDULE OF IMPROVEMENTS, PURPOSES AND AMOUNTS

A. Undertaking of the following road and pedestrian safety improvements: (i) installation of flashing pedestrian beacons at various locations and (ii) resurfacing or reconstruction of various roads or sections thereof (including drainage improvements, where necessary, and installation of handicapped access ramps), as set forth on a list prepared by the Town Engineer on file or to be placed on file with the Town Clerk, and hereby approved as if set forth herein in full. Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Town Council, there may be additions to or deletions from the list referred to in clause (ii) of the preceding sentence. It is hereby determined and stated that the roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").
