Cranford Library Reveals Multiple June Activities

CRANFORD — The Cranford Public Library is gearing up for its annual Summer Reading Program, and has multiple activities planned for June.

iDiscover Coding will teach youngsters the basics of coding. Each class will acquaint children with a coding concept through the use of fun, educational apps. Participants will create interactive stories, animation and even video games. Children in grades 1 to 3 can attend on Tuesdays, June 4 or 25, at 6:30 p.m., and those in grades 4 to 6 are welcome on June 4 from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. This free workshop is sponsored by a grant from the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders. Advance registration is not required.

In Fun with Robotics, children in grades 1 to 3 will learn how to use Dot and Dash robots and then take on fun, educational challenges. Registration is required and space is limited. This is a three-week series, taking place on Wednesdays, June 5, 12 and 19, from 4 to 5 p.m. Participants are asked to attend every session.
