Abel Crespo to the mat with a reverse head throw in 49 seconds.

The first bout of the evening, however, began at 106-lbs. Pat Kalnins, who placed third at the Union County Tournament (UCT) battled Panther Gabe Leo, who had placed second. Leo took a 4-1 lead but made a cardinal error by hanging his head. Kalnins capitalized and clamped Leo with a reverse cradle in 1:59.

"He was over me. I hooked his leg then I got his head and I was able to roll him over onto his back," Kalnins described.

As to his pin of the person who placed second at the UCT, Kalnins commented, "It feels pretty good."

Panther Mark Montgomery (UCT champ) knotted the team score at 6-6 when he pinned Evan Kanterman in 1:06 with an arm bar/tight waist at 113-lbs. After Capece's victory, Panther Josh Mejia squeezed out a 2-1 victory over Connor Halpin at 126-lbs when he got two back points with a spread eagle (banana split). At 132-lbs, Scorese presented an exhibition of nearfalls, tilts and a cradle to claim a 15-0, 5:25 technical fall over Dylan Camilo.

DiGiovanni had no takers at 138-lbs to receive a forfeit and to put the Cougars in front, 20-9. The 145-lb bout went to overtime and Panther Elvin Guerrero scored a double-leg takedown to edge AJ Bencivenga, 5-3. Another battle at 152-lbs had Panther Rene Perez using his twinning grapevine takedowns to top Mike Nigro, 7-3.

Emerging from the JV ranks Matt Doran was one of several Cougars who exercised fine top control and added a pair of takedowns and a reversal to beat Jeff Garcia, 6-1, at 160-lbs.

"Tough on top! It's good to get a win from guys who aren't always the guys who are getting the wins in tough matches. Going into this weekend where we have Queen of Peace, Hanover Park, just knowing that we

have a team effort and a JV guy who got a win. We just won the JV championship, so it's good to know we can count on them not to just save us points but to get us wins. It's going to be a big test for us this weekend," Coach Gorman said.

After McGovern's and Concina's victories made the team score 34-15, Cougar Dylan Budnik pinned Vinny Figueredo, who took second in the UCT at 220-lbs, in 2:00 with an arm bar/half nelson at 195-lbs.

"Me and my partner Anthony Ramirez were really working on that in the room. We have been grinding it out in practice and it worked out on the mat," Budnik said.

Budnik also had come off a strong showing having placed third at the UCT.

"I think I made a lot of progress from last year. I feel going forward you only do that when you get better in the room for districts and regions," Budnik said.

At 220-lbs, Ramirez became a victim of a double-leg tackle to a pin by Sean Matthews with 10 seconds left. Cougar Alex Esposito also had no takers at 285-lbs to receive a forfeit.

"We have great captains in 'Gov' [McGovern] and 'Gi' [DiGiovanni]. As a team, we hang out. We have a lot of fun together. It's really helping us not only off the mat but to keep on going to the playoffs [sections and tournaments]," Budnik said.

Cougars Top Hanover Park, Queen of Peace Wrestlers

The fourth-ranked Cranford High School wrestling team settled 11th-ranked Queen of Peace (QOP), 37-25, in Cranford on January 21 then traveled to Hanover Park on January 22 and defeated the 12th-ranked Hornets, 36-28. The double victories elevated the Cougars' record to 11-0.

The QOP match featured two major show downs. At 113-lbs, fifth-ranked Enrique Sanchez defeated Cougar Anthony Capece, 8-3, and at 132-lbs, Cougar Chris Scorese topped Ray Wetzel, 6-4. In the other bouts, Cougar Connor Halpin nipped Matt Chimato, 4-2, at 126-lbs. Tom DiGiovanni claimed a 10-0 major decision over Jean Carlo San Juan at 138-lbs and Mike Nigro won by 1:39 injury default over Justin Guzman at 145-lbs.

Cougar Brian McGovern edged Jacob Cardenas, 2-1, at 170-lbs and AJ Bencivenga dropped a tight, 3-2,

decision to Mike Pillot at 152-lbs. Cougar Vince Concina pinned Mike Mejiain 1:25 at 182-lbs, Dylan Budnik pinned Keyon Means Bosman in 5:10 at 220-lbs and Alex Esposito pinned Jason Kopich in 2:35 at 285-lbs.

The match against Hanover Park also featured some major show downs. Hornet Nick Raimo, ranked No. 1 at 126-lbs, jumped up to 132-lbs and stung No. 4 ranked Scorese, 11-6, and Lou Raimo, ranked No. 3 at 132-lbs, jumped up to 138-lbs and nipped DiGiovanni, 9-8. In other very close bouts, Nigro pulled out a 7-6 victory at 145-lbs, Halpin was edged, 3-2, at 126-lbs and Anthony Ramirez lost, 5-4, at 220-lbs.

The Cougars harvested huge bonus points with pins from Concina (ranked No. 6 at 170-lbs) at 182-lbs, McGovern at 160-lbs, Capece at 120-lbs, Josh DeChillo at 170-lbs and Esposito at 285-lbs. Bencivenga won by decision at 152-lbs.

ORDINANCE 16-19-S

BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING BOND ORDINANCE NUMBER 16-01-S FINALLY ADOPTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FANWOOD, NEW JERSEY ON MARCH 7, 2016

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF FANWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Bond Ordinance of the Borough Council of the Borough of Fanwood, in the County of Union, New Jersey (the "Borough") entitled "Bond Ordinance Providing An Appropriation Of \$965,000 For Various Capital Improvements For And By The Borough Of Fanwood In The County Of Union, New Jersey And, Authorizing The Issuance Of \$489,250 Bonds Or Notes Of The Borough For Financing Part Of The Appropriation" finally adopted on March 7, 2016 (the "Ordinance") is hereby incorporated by reference in its entirety.

Section 2. Sections 3(a)(1) and 3(a)(4) of the Ordinance is hereby amended in its entirety as follows:

Table with 5 columns: Improvements, Appropriation and Estimated Cost, Estimated Maximum Amount of Bonds or Notes, Period of Usefulness. Includes items like 'Various road improvements' and 'Streetscape on South Avenue'.

The Ordinance is hereby further amended by deleting the reference of 17.90 years for the useful life and substituting in lieu thereof 16.94 years.

Section 3. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolutions in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available therefor for public inspection.

Section 4. This Section 4 constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2. The Borough reasonably expects to pay expenditures with respect to the Improvements prior to the date that the Borough incurs debt obligations under this Bond Ordinance. The Borough reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the Borough under this Bond Ordinance. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for payment of the costs of the Improvements is \$489,250.

Section 5. All other provisions of the Ordinance shall remain unchanged.

Section 6. This amendatory bond ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final adoption as provided by Local Bond Law.

FSPY Men's 30+ Basketball Game Results & Standings:

The last of the unbeaten took it on the chin, as a trifecta of nail-biters highlighted Week Five play in the Fanwood-Scotch Plains YMCA Men's 30+ Basketball League.

Falcons 61, No Conscience 58: A barnburner opened the day's action, as the Falcons, led by Jason Shann's 24 points and seven rebounds, handed No Conscience its third straight loss. Rookie Clay Torres chipped in 14 points and seven rebounds, and center Troy Sims double-doubled (10 and 10) for the victors. N.C. received 57 of its 58 points from the quartet of Gregg Carder (18), Stephen Murray (16), Tim Gray (14) and Captain Chris Mattina (9). Both teams are now 2-3 for the season.

Size Matters 43, Get Buckets 40: Size Matters, playing without its leading point-getter and rebounder, Captain James Patrick, surprised previously undefeated Get Buckets, to forge a tie atop the standings. Jason Pompeo paced a balanced Size attack with 11 points, while Scott Lowder and Chris Burke each tallied 10 points. Get Buckets' prolific scorer Jamal Berry was held in check, his 16 points five below his norm. Captain Justin Fiory hit four from downtown to account for his 12 points.

Hickory Hoosiers 47, Slamma Jamma 33: Joe DeGennaro and David Ferreira both fired in 13 points, as the Hoosiers coasted in the only game of the day not decided in the final minute. Slam Jam found the iron unkind, connecting on just 32 percent of their tries, including 0-7 from beyond the arc. First-year player Greg Josephsen (11 points) and veteran Dave Berger (10) reached double figures, while the league's top rebounder, Gavin Ford, hauled down 12 caroms.

Flash-N-Bang 64, Drive N Dish 60: Two 1-3 teams in search of win No. 2, battled to avoid the basement. League-leading scorer Warren Lowe poured in 27 points, and running mate Omar Glover contributed 16 points and 10 boards, as Flash-N-Bang held off a pesky DND bunch. Guard Brian Ciemnicki drove and dished for 24 points and five dimes, while the frontcourt tandem of Chris Beaudry (11 and 9), and Steve Lee (11 and 7) were workmanlike for the tough luck losers.

Week Six play saw two once-beaten squads separate themselves from the rest of the pack as the teams reached the midpoint of the regular season.

Get Buckets 59, Slamma Jamma 37: The league's all-time leading scorer, Jamal Berry, turned in a vintage performance (31 points, 11 boards, 5-8 from beyond the arc), as Get Buckets rebounded from its lone loss in Week 5.
